Graduating to Life

Peninah Ndanu is considered a total orphan, she came to Huruma at an early age of 4-year-old in 2008 accompanied by her brother and sister after their mother died after a long illness. The mother was a single mother, so they had no one to take care of them.

Her sister came with health problems, she was HIV positive, unfortunately she didn't make it, and she passed away a few years ago. Her brother was also shot dead in the streets of Nairobi and therefore Peninah is all alone in her family.



Peninah started her schooling here in Huruma School and she graduated last year from high school. She is currently living in the transition house where she will be staying for the whole of this year. She has enrolled in a vocational college, training in Cosmetology for the next 6 months. She will be able to attain self-reliant skills and become independent.

H4Y has paid for all the costs to care for Peninah for the past eleven years. Most importantly we have come along side of her to encourage her and



pray for her and speak life to her as she has faced life challenges especially after losing her sister and brother.

When you sponsor a child through H4Y 100% of the money you give to children goes directly to that child, and you can communicate with them at any time by writing letters, sending email or even having a video meeting. This way you are directly involved in the life of the child.

We have personally visited Huruma and we talk to Momma Zipporah regularly to keep up with the school activities and the children. This has been a great partnership and we only hope to continue to grow in our support of Huruma and the children. Please continue to pray for Momma Zipporah and the children of Huruma and Peninah as she transitions to this new life.

Messianic Ministries

H4Y is committed to equipping the saints through the study of God's word. We have a study that focuses on scriptures from a Jewish perspective. It's amazing how much the scriptures come alive when we learn to recognize the Jewishness of the passages we read. Torah Club is a Bible study from the ministry of First Fruits of Zion. Serving Widows

H4Y continues to care for widows wherever we can. In Kenya we have helped provide for the needs of about thirty widows for the past eleven years. We send food each month and also provide funds so that they can receive health care check ups.

This year for Christmas we sent blankets to each widow that would help keep them warm during the cold winter months. This year was a difficult year as we saw several of the men and women pass away. Lucy Mutinda and her team provides regular love and support to this community by meeting regularly for bible study, worship and prayer. They also do special events like conferences as well. H4Y now provides support for widows in our local area as well. Please keep Lucy and her team in your prayers as well as all the widows in their community.

A VISION OF LIFE - THE HOPE OF OUR CALLING

From time to time someone will ask what is the long term vision of H4Y. Our vision is to build communities of hope. We would love to have one in Africa and one in the US. AuDera and Terance were foster parents for many years and saw the need for support of these children. A community of hope would be a place that provides housing for widows who have a heart to help train and lead young people. Housing for young people who are aging out of the system, but still need a home and guidance in the basic needs of life. Partnering these two together to support and help one another. Widows need companionship and help with things around the house and young people can do these things. Young people need wisdom and love from adults who care and widows can provide this. This has been a dream of H4Y for some time and we're believing that God will provide everything needed to fulfill it.





Mission of H4Y

In 2006 when Hope for You International was formed the purpose was to renew, restore and rebuild lives around the world. AuDera and Terance formed the mission organization so that they could help the people they were coming in contact with on their mission trips and over the years the ministry and the opportunities have expanded. At first they were given land in Uganda and had started supporting orphans by providing the seeds for them to start their own garden and then they supplied beds and mosquito nets and then medical care.

As they began to connect with other missionary organizations they found that they could achieve their goal by financially supporting those organizations and in effect partnering with them helped to grow H4Y. Today H4Y partners with about ten other missionary organizations around the world. It's not a lot, but for two people it has expanded the scope of what they could do alone.

AuDera made a trip to Cambodia to understand the sex trade industry and that opened doors to helping people there.

Over time they began to look for ways to help those locally as well. They began providing school supplies to children that needed them. They provided supplies to the homeless and then added support for widows. They were just trying to help people where they lived. Sometimes we think we need a lot of money and a big organization to make

A difference, but the truth is anyone can help and anyone can take the little that they have to make a difference for someone else. Just start where you are with whoever or whatever is in front of you. Everyone is looking for someone to help them, but only a few are actually choosing to just help. They don't have a lot. Our budget is about \$12,000 annually but H4Y has found that goes a long way towards helping people that really need it. In foreign countries it goes much further than it does here.

For those who support H4Y they can be sure that all of their support will go directly towards the mission of helping those in need. There is very little overhead, and no one receives a salary from H4Y. All income goes right back out to help the needy. Here are some of the mission groups that H4Y supports:

INDIA - Light to the Nations: John and Sara has three projects for children to provide food and education for those that live in the slums. An amazing couple and the work that they are doing is making a huge difference.

MIDDLE EAST - Andy and Erica they provide jobs and education as they share the gospel in a sensitive Moslem country.

BOLIVIA - Jonathan and Kara Asbun they provide support to children in orphanages and have an outreach to the women in the Red Light District.

JEWISH MINISTRIES- H4Y gives to several Messianic ministries that supports the gospel of Jesus going to the Jewish community and to help support Israel, also to teaching the body of Christ about their Jewish roots in the scriptures and how to grow in wisdom and understanding concerning knowing the Jewish Messiah.
